The Trained Nurses' Association of India (TNAI) is 109+ years old nurse organization founded in 1908 and registered under the Society Act XXI of 1860 in 1917. It represents nearly three lakh nurse members (including ANM) and 1.25 Lakh Student Nurses. It has a network of 32 State/UT Branches. TNAI has ever been working for advancement of professional, educational, socio-economic and general welfare of nurses and community at large, besides systematically contributing to the national health programmes.

Emergence of the Trained Nurses Association of India (TNAI) as a government-accredited placement agency is yet another milestone in its onward journey towards improving the lot of nurses in the country.

TNAI has registered as a recruiting agent to place Indian nurses in overseas locations. The certificate is issued by the Protector General of Emigrants, Ministry of External Affairs. Since decades of the foreign recruitment it is been learnt that nurses seeking employment outside India in any country is financially exploited, being made them to pay exorbitant amount.

Concerned at the exploitative, unethical and deceptive practices of certain unscrupulous agencies operating in this area, TNAI had long been contemplating to provide a safe and fair mechanism to the Nurses, who in increasing numbers, seek employment within the country or abroad.

TNAI shall bring big relief to the Nurses seeking foreign assignments, who shall be enabled to fulfill their dreams for a modest fee rather than shelling out enormous money to the agents of dubious integrity so far monopolizing the employment market.

TNAI is always have concern for the safety and security of the nurses in their work field. In this regard, TNAI is arranging an awareness campaign on safe emigration-Nurses need to know.
