Health Coverage for All, Anywhere

n 7 April each year, World Health Organisation (WHO) celebrates World Health Day to coincide with its foundation date way back in 1948. The objective is, to enhance awareness about maintaining proper physical and psycho logical well being of all. Considering that significant populations remain deprived of advances in health care, the theme selected for World Health Day this year is, Universal Health Coverage: Everyone, Everywhere.

The TNAI has always stood by the nurses particularly its members for their interests, and also feels that its membership base must enhance. The TNAI Executive Committee/ Council in its last meeting (in Nov-Dec 2017 during Guntur SNA Conference) took following decisions of interest to the existing and prospective members.

Concession under bulk membership plan: Nurses (non-TNAI members) being enrolled as Life Member under bulk membership plan, viz. with at least 100 members in one go, shall be allowed to pay reduced charges of Rs. 3,000/- (normal charges being Rs. 3,600), thus entailing a discount of Rs. 600/-.

Life Time Achievement Award: Up to 5 (five) awards shall be conferred on the TNAI Members for having made commendable contribution to TNAI. The awardees shall be entitled to a memento, cash of Rs. 50,000/-, both ways travel expenses for commuting to TNAI Hqrs and three days' board & lodging expenses. Felicitating Senior Council Members: Nurses having completed 16 years of service as TNAI Council member shall be honoured with a memento and cash of Rs. 50,000/-, air travel expenses to and from TNAI Hqrs, together with board and lodging for three days.

Benefits to SNA Units: Three cash awards shall be given to three best SNA Units based on their performance during the year. These can be handed out during SNA Conference. All SNA Units shall be provided one set of publications without any charges. These publications can be further passed on to needy students. Also, in future, SNA Units shall be exempted from TNAI Orientation Fee. The fee shall be chargeable only for non-SNA Units. However, the tea/ refreshment during Orientation shall be continued to be served, as per visit time.

The practice of payment of charges by State Branches towards publication of Nomination Sheet or Provisional Ballot Paper or Election Results in TNAI Bulletin (as applicable till now) has also been abolished.

SNA/TNAI members applying for Scholarship shall not have to pay the application money (Rs. 100/- as of now).

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Members shall also be exempted from the fee for participating in Exhibition or Essay or any other competition during biennial conference. The Life Membership Fee for Religious Sisters has been cut short from the existing Rs. 1,200/- to Rs. 1,000/-. Further, members participating in programmes of American Heart Association (AHA)-approved International Training Centre at CIN&R premises shall be eligible for concessional rates. As for new TNAI photo Identity cards, these shall be issued in lieu of old Identity cards free of cost. However, those desiring duplicate I-card shall have to pay Rs. 150/-.

We believe you shall be undertaking necessary spade work for participation in activities of International Nurses' Day on 12 May in your purview around the theme, Nurses: A Voice to Lead, Health is a Human Right. Happy Nurses' Day!

उल्लेखनीय है कि घर में पकाए सुपाच्य, स्वास्थ्यवर्धक और सुरक्षित भोजन के बजाए नूडल्स, मोमो, बर्गर आदि बाजार की जायकेदार, स्वादिष्ट आइटमों के नियमित सेवन से बच्चों में मोटापा, ब्लड प्रेशर, शूगर आदि खतरनाम बीमारियों में इजाफा दर्ज हो रहा है। शोधकर्ताओं की राय में फास्ट फूड कंपनियों की मार्किटिंग बहुत दमदार और असरदाई है और बच्चों के स्वास्थ्य के साथ खिलवाड़ करने पर तुली है।

शोधकर्ताओं ने पाया कि ब्राजील, भारत, नाइजीरिया, पाकिस्तान और रूस में खासकर जो बच्चे मैकडोलाल्ड, केएफसी, कोका कोला आदि अंतराष्ट्रीय फास्ट फूड कंपनियों के लोगो तुरंत पहचान जाते हैं और वे उसकी पुरजोर मांग करते हैं। बच्चों में देसी लस्सी के बदले कोका कोला की डिमांड की यही वजह है।

School of Nursing Science and Research, Sharda University, Greater Noida (UP): A two-day National Conference on leadership in Nursing on the theme **Transitioning Leadership**: A Leading Change on 16-17 February 2018. The chief guest of the conference was Dr Ratna Prakash, Principal, Pal CON and the guest of honor was Dr Bimla Kapoor, Dean Academics, Berkley Health Education. Eminent nursing luminaries from academics including Dr Harjinderjeet Goyal, Principal RAK CON; Prof Pranati Barua, Principal, Amity University; Dr Prema, Professor, TMU University; Dr Ashiaa Quereshi, Principal, Galgotias University; Dr Ramninder Kalra, Principal, Holy Family CON; Dr Simon, Principal, Noida International University; Prof Yadidya, Principal, Mayo CON; Dr Manju Chhugani, Principal, Jamia Hamdard University; Dr Nagendra Prakash, Academic Advisor, Pal CON; Kh Linda Devi, Associate professor, R Sree Raja Kumar, and Dani Philip, all three Associate Professors at Sharda University addressed various sessions. Criteria for all the scientific presentations

(Theme, Sub themes, and Concurrent Interest sessions)

- 1. All presentations should be based on Research papers.
- 2. The scientific paper should contain: Introduction, Need and Significance, Problem statement, Objectives, Hypothesis/Assumptions, Conceptual Framework, Review of Literature (two relevant studies), Brief description of Methods and Procedures, discussions, Findings and Interpretation to be placed in one or two tables, Conclusion, Implications, Recommendation and References / Bibliography.
- 3. One member can present one paper only.
- 4. Maximum Two authors can present one paper.

IV. Poster presentation

All Posters for the presentation should be based on **Research papers** like a visual presentation of the scientific paper on any nursing specialties by individual TNAI member for display; Size of the Poster/ Flex should be approximately 30x40 inches; Ideas depicted in the poster should be relevant to the study; Lettering and design of the poster should be bold and big enough to be seen from a distance; Layout of the picture, if any must be properly balanced to give a correct sense of proportion; Extra fixing of clipping cuttings or any other form on the poster should be avoided.

The poster should depict the following: Introduction, Need and Significance, Problem

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statement, Objectives, Review of Literature (two relevant studies), Brief description of Methods and Procedures, Findings and Interpretation to be placed in one or two tables, Conclusion, Implications, Recommendation and References / Bibliography.

Poster should not have any identification (code will be given before display).

The Date and time of displaying the poster will be communicated later through forthcoming journal.

Please note:

- " The study carried out within three years period are only entertained.
- The researcher / presenters should be a Member of TNAI. The word limit for the scientific paper presentation are 2000. Enclose separate sheet for author / authors name and a paragraph of bio data, complete address, phone number, email, and TNAI number.
- All the presenters should register for the conference. No TA DA will be provided to the presenters.
- The TNAI will be awarding certificate along with the credit hours to the presenters. The delegates / participants will get the participation certificate along with the 16 credit hours purely based on the registration and attendance.



The Trained Nurses' Association of India invites applications for award of scholarship for higher studies in Nursing for the year 2017-18. Scholarships are available for the following courses.

I. FOR GENERAL NURSES

- a) Post Certificate Diploma course in Nursing Education and Administration, and other speciality courses.
- b) Post-Basic BSc Nursing (Regular).
- c) Students pursuing Post-Basic BSc Nursing through Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) can also apply who have successfully completed the first year (candidates receiving salary or any other financial support will not be eligible).

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EVENTS OF THE MONTH

World Health Day: 7 April

World Health Organisation (WHO), the global health care body, celebrates World Health Day on 7 April, to mark the anniversary of its foundation in 1948. The objective is, to enhance awareness about maintaining proper physical and psychological well being of all. Each year a theme is selected for World Health Day that highlights a priority area of concern for WHO. This year's theme of World Health Day is: Universal health coverage: everyone, everywhere.

World Health Day is a global campaign, inviting everyone – from global leaders to the public in all countries – to focus on a single health challenge with global impact. Focusing on new and emerging health issues, World Health Day provides an opportunity to start collective action to protect people's health and well-being.

The slogan remains, "Health for All", the guiding vision for more than seven decades. It's also the impetus behind the current organization-wide drive to support countries in moving towards Universal Health Coverage (UHC). WHO calls on world leaders to live up to the pledges made when they agreed the Sustainable Development Goals in 2015, and commit to concrete steps to advance the health of all people. There shall be a series of events through 2018, starting on World Health Day on 7 April with global and local conversations about ways to achieve health for all.

The buzzwords are: inspire, motivate and guide. Policy-makers of the member-states need to be inspired to transform the health of their nation, framing the challenge as exciting and ambitious, and inviting them to be part of the change; motivated by sharing examples of how some countries are already progressing towards universal health coverage and guided by equipping them with tools for structured policy dialogue on how to advance universal health coverage.

International Nurses Day: 12 May

The most enthusiastically awaited day for entire nurse community globally is the International Nurses' Day (IND) on 12 May, in remembrance of the Nurse legend, Florence Nightingale who was born this day in 1820. All healthcare functionaries also participate in the celebrations of the day, as endorsement of the substantial contribution nurses make in saving and improving the lives of the sick, the elderly and others in need. Every year a theme is identified as thurst of activities; the theme for 2018 is, Nurses: A Voice to Lead, Health is a Human Right.

A Candle Lamp service in Westminster Abbey, London is the held, a candle lamp is handed over from one nurse to another, symbolic of passing the knowledge from one nurse to another, and finally placed on the High Altar. Next day, on 13 May a grand ceremony is organised at the St Margaret's Church, the burial place of Florence Nightingale. Main highlights of the day are the promotional and educational activities all over the world, to address issues being faced by nurses and appreciate their contribution.

In New Delhi, the President of India confers the Florence Nightingale National awards to select nurse professionals for outstanding services rendered in their respective fields at a function in Rashtrapati Bhawan, New Delhi. The awardees are selected on the basis of rigorous screening of applications received on All-India basis by the Ministry of Health & Family Affairs. TNAI also celebrates the IND befittingly.

Every year, the International Council of Nurses brings out a reference material, the IND Kit. This year's 56-page ICN Toolkit 2018 contains a review of the nursing affairs and makes region-wise recommendations for nurses. The message from ICN President has been reproduced as follows:

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Message from the ICN President, International Council of Nurses

The International Council of Nurses (ICN) believes that health is a human right. ICN is at the forefront of advocating for access to health and nurses are the key to delivering it. All over the world, there are individuals and communities who are suffering from illness due to a lack of accessible and affordable health care. But we must also remember that the right to health applies to nurses as well! We know that improved quality and safety for patients depends on positive working environments for staff. That means the right to a safe working environment, adequate remuneration, and access to resources, and education. We must add to this the right to be heard and have a voice in decision making and policy development implementation!

As the global voice of nursing, ICN will continue to speak up and speak out. In 2018, ICN is doing this louder and stronger than ever before. Following the 2018 IND theme, Nurses: A Voice to Lead, Health is a Human Right, this toolkit presents compelling evidence showing how investment in nursing leads to economic development; and how improving conditions in which people live leads to cohesive societies and productive economies. For nurses, Health is a Human Right means that all humans have the right to access affordable and quality health care at a time when they need it most. And there are nurses working in everyday health care settings and in positions of influence and decision making that are doing this right now!

This International Nurses Day, let us join together to share how nurses are transforming health care and health systems so that no person is left behind. Let us join our voices together to be a voice to lead by supporting a people—centred approach to care and health systems, and ensuring our voices are heard in influencing health policy, planning and provision. On behalf of us all at ICN, Happy International Nurses Day!
