Much Remains to be Achieved by Women

istorical bias, discrimination and prejudices against women everywhere have been a major obstacle in their development. The first significant initiative to correct the anti-women ethos was witnessed when way back in 1908 some 15,000 women marched in New York streets demanding their rights. Since then, every year **8 March** began to be observed as **International Women's Day** (IWD). The day highlights the vital role women have been rendering within home and in outside spheres. On this day achievements of women on social, economic, scientific, cultural and political fronts are remembered and appreciated. The theme for International Women's Day 2017 is, 'Women in the Changing World of Work: Planet 50-50 by 2030'. The need to encourage women's participation in mainstream development assumes greater importance as the World Economic Forum predicts a dismal picture of gender equity by stating that gender gap would not close entirely until 2186! It is a period too long to wait. It is therefore essential that despite having made big strides in creative, political, technological fields, policies and programmes to promote their participation in all sectors continue to be strengthened.

Many health problems in our age arise due to malfunctioning of kidney, essential to remove wastes from body, regulate electrolytes, maintain acid-base balance, regulate blood pressure and secrete various hormones. Malfunctioning of kidney due to any reason can destabilise the life of affected person. **World Kidney Day** on second Thursday of March (**9 March** this year) is a joint initiative of the International Society of Nephrology and the International Federation of Kidney Foundations, focusing this year on the importance of the kidneys and reducing the frequency and impact of kidney disease and associated problems, worldwide. The campaign is celebrated yearly in 100+ countries. The activities include: educating public on the role of kidney in maintenance of health and urging medical professionals of the important role they can play to in detecting problems encourage more systematic screening of patients.

The ages old disease, tuberculosis (TB) remains an epidemic in most parts of the world, killing about 1.5 million people every year, mostly in developing countries. It can spread through the air when people with active TB infection cough, sneeze, or otherwise transmit their saliva through the air. If left untreated, kills more than half of those so infected. **World Tuberculosis**Day on 24 March every year commemorates this day in 1882 when Dr Robert Koch discovered the cause of TB bacillus. In

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India, about 2.2 million people develop TB and at least 2.20 lakh people die from the disease. It can affect person of any age, caste or class; the poor, tribal people, slum dwellers, prisoners, cotton mill workers and persons with impaired immune systems being more vulnerable. In India, the TB treatment & care is covered by the government's Revised National TB Control Programme (RNTCP) of Government and private sector. The aim is, to extend outreach of RNTCP services for all persons diagnosed with TB, including those with drug-resistant.

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TNAI SCHOLARSHIPS - 2017

The Trained Nurses' Association of India invites applications for awarding scholarships for higher studies in Nursing for the year 2017. Scholarships are available for the following courses.

I. FOR GENERAL NURSES

- (a) Post Certificate Diploma course in Nursing Education and Administration, and other speciality courses
- (b) Post Basic BSc Nursing (Regular)
- (c) Students pursuing Post-Basic BSc Nursing through Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) can also apply who have successfully completed the first year (Candidates receiving salary or any other financial support will not be eligible)
- (c) Master of Nursing
- (d) PhD, MPhil in Nursing

II. FOR HEALTH VISITORS AND AUXILIARY NURSE MIDWIVES / MPHW (F)

- (a) General Nursing and Midwifery course.
- (b) Any short-term course of not less than three months duration.

All the above mentioned courses and the institution should be recognized by Indian Nursing Council.

Eligibility criteria

- The candidates should have at least 3 years' membership of the TNAI.
- Confidential reports from all the three referees mentioned in your application should be received timely.
- The application should be recommended by the President or Secretary of the concerned State Branch
- Preference will be given to the candidate's active participation in TNAI activities at National, State, District / Zonal and Unit level.
- The proof of annual family income of the candidates (who wish to apply for scholarship) should be obtained from competent authority and attached along with the application.
- The Candidate should not be a recipient of any other scholarship or any financial help from any other source.
- The candidate should not have received TNAI scholarship for at least last 5 years.

General Conditions

- (a) The completed application forms should be received in this office along with processing fee of Rs. 100/- by demand draft in favour of TNAI by **May 31, 2017**.
- (b) All applications should be signed by / routed through your TNAI State Branch, President/ Secretary.

EVENTS OF THE MONTH

International Women's Day: 8 March

Traditional bias against female gender and discrimination against women everywhere has been a big obstacle in their development. That is why they have remained behind on many fronts. To highlight the vital role women have been rendering within home and in outside world, in almost all sectors. Every year since 1908 – when 15,000 women marched in New York streets demanding their rights – 8 March is being observed as International Women's Day (IWD) to remember, appreciate and celebrate the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of the women. IWD is seen by women organizations and people at large as a vehicle for social change. The theme for International Women's Day 2017 focuses on 'Women in the Changing World of Work: Planet 50-50 by 2030'.

Income generation by women is seen as an important way to empower women. Therefore, year by year, women are joining the work force. Further, the nature of work place is undergoing transformation with significant implications for women. Globalization, technology and digital revolution are bringing many opportunities for them. To ensure women's economic empowerment in the changing world, the issues like bridging the gender pay gap need to be addressed. Also, policies must count for the overwhelming majority of women in the informal economy, promote women's access to innovative technologies and practices, decent work and climate-resilient jobs and protect women from violence in the work place. The means of celebrating IWD include conducting seminars, women parade, conferences, banners, debates, presentations, speech, competitive activities, awareness campaigns suggestive of importance of education, career opportunities etc. The World Economic Forum predicts a dismal picture in respect of gender equity. It says, the gender gap would not close entirely until 2186! It is a period too long to wait and formidable challenge to the policy makers, social activists and women groups that needs to be tackled with coordinated efforts of all.

World Tuberculosis Day: 24 March

Despite appreciable advancements in medical science, the ages old disease tuberculosis (TB) remains an epidemic in many parts of the world, causing the deaths of nearly 1.5 million people each year, mostly in developing countries. It is a common, and in many cases infectious, fatal disease caused by various strains of mycobacteria. It typically attacks the lungs but can also affect other parts of the body. Tuberculosis can spread through the air when people who have an active TB infection cough, sneeze, or otherwise transmit their saliva through the air. If left untreated, kills more than half of those so infected.

World Tuberculosis Day on 24 March commemorates this day in 1882 when Dr Robert Koch surprised the scientific community by announcing about his having discovered the cause of tuberculosis i.e. the TB bacillus. It is a day to build public awareness about the global epidemic of tuberculosis and efforts to eliminate the disease.

In India, some 2.2 million people develop TB in India every year and at least 2.20 lakh people die from the disease. The disease can affect person of any age, caste or class but majority of cases are from economically poor class. Tribal people, slum dwellers, prisoners, cotton mill workers and persons with impaired immune systems are more affected. In India, the TB treatment & care is covered by the government's Revised National TB Control Programme (RNTCP) of Government as also private sector. The 5-year National Strategic Plan for 2012 - 17, has a vision of a TB free India, through achieving Universal Access by provision of quality diagnosis and treatment for all TB patients in the country. The policy targeted extending the outreach of RNTCP services for all persons diagnosed with TB, including those with drug-resistant TB and those seeking treatment in private sector.

World Kidney Day: 9 March (Second Thursday, March)

Kidney is a vital organ in human body regulating its various functions. It removes wastes from body, regulates electrolytes, maintains acid-base balance, regulates BP and secretes various hormones. Malfunctioning of kidney due to any reason can destabilize the life of a person. A joint initiative of the International Society of Nephrology and the International Federation of Kidney Foundations, World Kidney Day on 9 March is a global health awareness campaign focusing on the importance of the kidneys and reducing the frequency and impact of kidney disease and associated health problems, worldwide. The campaign is celebrated yearly on the second Thursday of March in 100+ countries. If detected early, chronic kidney disorder (CKD), a condition impinging on many physiological parameters, is treatable. The activities of the campaign include: educating public on the role of kidney in maintenance of health and urging medical professionals of the important role they can play to in detecting problems encourage more systematic screening of patients.

In the last stage of chronic kidney disease, called end-stage renal disease, the kidneys are just unable to remove enough wastes and unwanted excess fluids from the body. At this point, dialysis is often the only option with the patients, usually up to three times a week. If that too does not provide necessary relief, transplant – a costly proposition – is the only way. It is held that increasing incidence of diabetes and hypertension lead to inflation in cases of chronic kidney disease. In India, not less than 2.5 lakh people succumb to kidney diseases every year. Diabetes and high blood pressure are the two precipitating factors.

The theme of the Conference is: "Empowering Nurses through Advanced Technology"

A. SNA Competitions

- 1. The Scientific Paper Presentation will be based on the Conference theme.
- Debate on "Power conflict and Challenges in Empowerment of Nurses"
- 3. Quiz competition on various Nursing subjects including General Knowledge.
- 4. Essay Competition
- 5. Poster Presentation (Topics will be announced later)
- 6. On-the-Spot Painting
- 7. Floor Decoration (Rangoli)
- 8. Sports: The events are: 100 Meters Race/ Discus throw and Javelin throw.
- 9. Personality Development Competitions (Mr. SNA and Miss SNA)

B. Criteria for the Competitions

- **1. Scientific Paper Presentation:** The Scientific Paper Presentation will be made by the Student Nurses on the Conference theme.
 - 1. The paper should contain Introduction, Need and significance in Nursing, Statement of the Problem, Objectives, Review of Literature, Brief description of Methods and Procedures, Findings and Interpretation to be placed in one or two tables, Recommendation, Conclusion and Bibliography.
 - 2. One hard copy and soft copy in CD of the Scientific Paper containing not more than 1500 words (4-5 pages in A-4 size) should be submitted to the State SNA Advisor before the State SNA Conference of the respective State.
 - 3. Best three Scientific Papers, selected at the State Level have to be forwarded by the State SNA Advisor to the TNAI Headquarters by 31 July 2017 for final evaluation at national level.

The author(s) of Best papers, selected by the TNAI Headquarters will give intimate to the presenter for presentation at National Level SNA Conference 2017.

- 2. Debate: "Power conflict and Challenges in Empowerment of Nurses". Only one individual entry will be permitted from each State. Language of the topic will be either Hindi or English. Only a single entry either in Hindi or English will be allowed from each State. Time allotted will be 5 minutes (First bell at 4 minutes and Final bell at 5 minutes).
- **3. Quiz Competition:** Quiz competition on various Nursing subjects including General Knowledge. *General Rules*
 - 1. Direct questions will get 10 marks.

- Pass on questions will get 5 marks.
- 3. Direct questions will have 30 seconds for answering and no extra time will be allowed for pass on questions.
- 4. First answer from each team will be entertained.
- 5. Scorer will be there and score will be displayed on a board.
- 6. The decision of the Quiz masters at the National level will be the final.

- 1. Preliminary Round for all 25 MCQ questions
- 2. 30 minutes will be given Put tick mark () against correct answer.
- 3. On the basis of the result, top 6 teams will be selected.

Words limit is 1000. Candidate can write in Hindi or English. Evaluation is done by 3 experts. Time allotted will be one hour. *Criteria for Evaluation:* Introduction; Relevance to the Topic; Organization of the content (Grammar, Language, Vocabulary, Spelling); Use of Examples and Current Trends; Implications; Conclusion.

5. Poster Presentation

Note:

Section 1-2 are for ANM students / MPHW (F) students.

Section 3-9 are for GNM/B.Sc Nursing Students.

Section 10-11 are for all categories (ANM/GNM/BSc) Nursing students.

The criteria for Poster Presentation

Size: Standard size (22"x26") approx. for both individual and group poster presentation.

Topics: Ideas depicted in the poster should be relevant to the topics given above.

Lettering and design of the poster should be bold and big enough to be seen from a distance.

Clarity: For bringing clarity of the poster, restrict yourself to one idea relevant to the topic.

Layout of pictures in the poster must be properly balanced to give a correct sense of proportion.

No Extra fixing of clippings/cuttings or any other form on the poster.

The poster should depict originality and innovative ideas.

- **6. On-the-Spot Painting:** The topic will be announced just before the competition. Only one individual entry will be permitted from each State. Participants should bring their own painting materials, the organisers will provide only the paper. No Mechanical devices, e.g. use of stencils, etc. will be permitted. Time allotted will be **One Hour**.
- **7. Floor Decoration (Rangoli):** The size is 3x3 feet. Participants will bring their own material. No mechanical devices e.g., use of stencils etc. will be allowed. Theme/Topic will be given on the spot. Only one individual entry will be permitted from each State. Time allotted for Rangoli will be **Two Hours**.
- **8. Sports:** The events are: 100 Meters Race/ Discus throw and Javelin throw. Competitions for these events will be held separately for **male and female contestants**. The best entries (one female and one male) selected at the state level are to be sent by the State SNA Advisor to the TNAI Headquarters for national level competition.

10. Biennial SNA Diary Evaluation for (2015 & 2016)

Unit Level: SNA units should record the activities and to be signed by the unit SNA Secretary and unit SNA Advisor and the same to be forward to the State SNA Advisor for evaluation.

State Level: After receiving the SNA Diary from each unit it should be evaluated at the State level. The State SNA Advisor should write remarks and with the seal and signature then, the two outstand ing diaries from each State should be sent to the TNAI Headquarters by July 31st, 2017 for the final evaluation.

Note: Since 1988 [Minute No. SNA-GC/18/88/3(i)], Diaries of MPHW(F)/ ANM students are evaluated separately.

Criteria

These diaries are assessed keeping in view the various unit activities, viz., professional, educational,

extra-curricular, social, cultural and recreational. Proper maintenance of diary is another criterion. In general the focus of assessment is on the diversity of activities carried out by the units as reflected in the Diary. SNA to TNAI membership enrollment for two years.

11. Talent Night: Each State will be given one item for presentation at the national level. Only one best folk (or) classical dance either individual or group (not more than 8 members) from each State will be accepted for competition at the national level. Time: **3 Minutes** for Classical and **7 minutes** for Folk Dance.

किडनी प्रत्यारोपण में भारतीय डाक्टरों की सफलता

पेट के निचले हिस्से में दोनों तरफ स्थित मनुष्य की किडनियां तमाम अंदरुनी प्रणालियों के संचालन में महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाती हैं। इनका कार्य है पाचन प्रक्रिया के दौरान फालतू, अवांछित सामग्री को पेशाब के जरिए निष्कासित करते रहना, शरीर के इलैक्ट्रोलाइट्स को नियामित (रेगुलेट) करना, एसिडों और क्षारों (बेस) का संतुलन बनाए रखना, रक्त चाप (ब्लड प्रेशर) एकसार रखना और हार्मोन्स उत्सर्जित करना। यही कारण है किडनी कमजोर पड़ जाने से अनेक प्रक्रियाएं सुचारू रूप से कार्य करना बंद कर देती हैं और व्यक्ति रोगग्रस्त हो जाता है।

किडनी जब इतना अधिक क्षतिग्रस्त हो जाए कि दवाओं से इन्हें दुरस्त न किया जा सके तो एक ही विकल्प बचा रहता है — स्वस्थ किडनी का प्रत्यारोपण। यह प्रक्रिया स्वयं में बहुत जटिल है और हमारे देश में अभी तक किडनी प्रत्यारोपण में सीमित स्तर पर ही सफलता मिली है। इसका एक कारण है, पूरी तरह मैचिंग करती किडनी हासिल करना दृष्कर हो जाता है।

देश में किडनी प्रत्यारोपण का दसवां सफल केस इसी जनवरी के अंत में नागपुर के सुपर स्पेशल्टी अस्पताल के नेफोलोजी विभाग में दर्ज किया गया। 65 साल के एक व्यक्ति ने अपने 35 वर्षीय बेटे को किडनी दान की। हुआ यों कि रोगी की मां की किडनी मैच नहीं हो पाई और पिता की किडनी में पथरी निकली। डाक्टरों ने पहले पथरी को निकाला, उसके एक माह बाद प्रत्यारोपण किया गया। इस प्रकरण से पूर्व एक पिता ने अपनी बेटी के लिए किडनी दान किया था, शेष सभी मामलों में किडनी दाता महिलाएं ही रही हैं।
