The National Skills Labs seek to provide a platform for augmenting the Skills of Health personnel involved in the delivery of RMNCH+A services across public health institutions in the country. After setting up of tripartite [LSTM, TNAI and Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW)], The National Skills Lab at TNAI, Greater Noida (UP) was established in 2014. Its objectives are: Improving the maternal and newborn health services in the country; Enhancing competencies of the health care providers under RMNCH+A services

in the Public Institutions; Reducing the MMR and the IMR in India; Facilitating acquisition/ reinforcement of standardised technical skills and knowledge of service providers for RMNCH+A services; Improving the quality of preservice training and; Providing continuing Nursing education / continuing medical education. The MoU between TNAI and MoHFW was signed in June 2016. So far the National Skills Lab (Daksh), TNAI, Greater Noida has conducted ten training covering 107 participants from ten States.

National Eye Donation Fortnight

The National Fortnight on Eye Donation is celebrated nationally. Our country has about 52 million visually impaired people i.e. suffering from the corneal blindness (constituting a fifth of the blind people of the world). About 270,000 children are blind. Further, some 20,000 new cases of the eye blindness are added every year. So it has become very necessary to educate the people of the society including both young and old to reduce the demand-supply gap of the cornea.

More disheartening is the fact that the majority of blind people are young and their eye sight can be restored through corneal transplantation technique alone. Common reasons for loss of eye sight are: injuries, eye infections, Vitamin A deficiency and malnutrition, congenital or other factors.

Observed every year during 25 August - 8 September under the National Programme for Control of Blindness, the National Eye Donation Fortnight attempts to create public awareness to pledge their eyes for donation after death.

Facts about Eye Donation

- * Anyone at any age, even with past eye surgery or poor vision or diabetes can donate eyes.
- * Eye donation is a priceless gift to the corneal blind.
- * The donation takes place after the death of donor. Eyes of a donated person go to two different corneal blind individuals so that two persons are enabled to see the world with single donation.
- * Eye donation can be pledged by calling many agencies operating in eye transplant or it can be pledged in any eye bank. The facility of eye donation is also available online.
- * The process of comea transplant takes place 4 to 6 hours after death of donor. Confidentiality of bo the donor and the recipient are maintained.
- * Eyes can be donated only with the written consent of the next of kin in the presence of two witnesses.

साइनस तथा नाक की हड्डी में विकृति के समाधान के लिए नेति किया प्राकृतिक चिकित्सा की लोकप्रिय तकनीक है, इसके तहत नाक के एक छेद से पानी अंदर डाल कर दूसरे से निकाला जाता है।


